# **Meeting Minutes**

- A. Call to Order by Mr. Davidson at 6:00 pm
  - a. Prayer led by Ms. Dunn
  - b. November meeting minutes approved (no meeting held in December)
- B. Old Business none

- D. Communications & Reports
  - a. Administrator's report provided by Ms. Redleski Appendix A
    - i. Overview of the Virtue=Strength<sup>™</sup> program provided
      - School parents and parishioners were invited to a presentation on the VS<sup>TM</sup> program given by Lou Judd, VS Executive Director, and Erin Redleski, Principal on January 11<sup>th</sup> at Murphy Hall (~12 school families in attendance and 5-10 parishioners)
      - Mr. Schoborg inquired about the length of the contract and if the content will repeat over the years. Ms. Redleski explained that new


content will be added each year; however, some repetition is to be expected and that is good.

- Mr. Lambert asked if the VS program is run at a diocesan level. Ms.
   Redleski shared that several diocesan schools use it but the decision is made independently at the school level.
- ii. Overview of Catholic Schools Week activities provided Appendix B
  - Ms. Redleski is reviewing the week for additional opportunities to infuse Catholicism. Ms. Dunn suggested a link between virtues and the occupational dress up day creating a connection between their desired vocation and the virtues.
- b. Religious education report provided by Anita Dunn Appendix C
  - i. Teaching mass was held for the evening religion class and several parents participated
    - Ms. Hasselbeck inquired about the teaching mass and if that is offered to school families. This suggestion is to be passed to Ms.
       Willig for consideration by the Catholic Identity committee.
       Additionally, Ms. Dunn recommended a FORMED production on the Sacrament of the Eucharist.
    - Ms. Dunn mentioned upcoming awards from the diocese around outstanding catechesis teachers. Ms. Dunn will coordinate with Ms. Redleski.
- c. Pastor's report provided by Fr. Keene
  - i. Disciple Maker Index (Survey/Questionnaire) was discussed.
  - ii. St. Agnes had the highest percentage of respondents and is following the CLI model for interpretation. Fr. Keene explained that the process allows us to be more intentional with how we set goals and priorities for the parish and school.
  - iii. Mr. Craig inquired about the timeframe for the goals and priorities. Fr. Keene responded that it is a 3-year plan and each goal is time bound following the S.M.A.R.T. process.
  - iv. Parish council is working on the interpretation of the data. Information will be forthcoming.
- E. Committee Updates
  - a. Safety Updates M. Lambert Ms. Redleski
    - i. Broken gym door has been replaced and film applied to the new door
    - Discussions are being held at the diocesan level regarding locating Naloxboxes on school premises. This will be a decision between Pastor and Administrator.
    - iii. Mr. Schoborg inquired about any follow up from the safety consultant regarding the building assessment. Ms. Redleski shared that the consultant has not been responsive.

- iv. Ms. Dunn shared that the monastery door was recently ajar. Ms. Redleski and Fr. Keene agreed that this door has been a consistent issue and needs to be replaced. Next step will be to coordinate with Rick.
- b. Finance no update- meetings to resume in the Spring
  - i. Mr. McCormack requested a forecast for enrollment next year and the diocesan maximum determination.
  - ii. Discussion was held on the challenges faced trying to account for the 25% increase in benefits last year and the increase cap provided by the diocese. Additionally, the graduating class is large compared to recent enrollments.
